Summary Report of I-CARE Activities for the period Aug 2018-July 2020

A. Introduction

I-CARE is a trust registered under Indian Charitable Trust Act with Director, VSSC as its patron. Permanent employees of ISRO, including retired staff, are its members. Right from its inception, it has been involved in various charity initiatives, with the beneficiaries ranging from individuals to groups. This report narrates the details of programmes undertaken by I-CARE till date.

B. Summary of I-CARE Campaigns

I. Helping Hand to Flood Affected (ISRO & Non- ISRO) during Aug 2018 – Sep 2018

Several programmes were officially taken up by VSSC, LPSC and IISU in response to the emergent situation arising out of the floods in Kerala which rocked the state in August 2018. These included medical camps, release of TOMD services and making VSSC housing colony ready for air-lifted people. In addition to this, volunteers from ISRO contributed in man and material towards the various activities connected with relief, cleaning and rehabilitation. ISRO volunteers were actively involved in bulk procurement of medicines and clothes, collecting, sorting, loading of relief materials and arranging transportation at District administration collection centres. Other initiatives by Space Engineers Association (SEA), “Kuttanadinuoru Kaithangu” by Staff Benevolent Fund (SBF) and “Wayanad Fund” by the Women Employees Benevolent Forum (WEB), fund-raising and collection of relief materials by clubs/societies of VSSC, like Spectrum were also operated in parallel.

The programme ‘Thiruvonam@Venmony’, conceived by I-CARE team, was conducted successfully with distribution of 250 kits, including Onakkodis, each costing around Rs 1080, to 3 relief camps at Venmony, Chengannur, ravaged by the overflowing AchanKovil river.

A new package named ‘ASWAS’, meaning ‘Aid to Staffs’ Welfare And Security’, was introduced to give financial aid to the needy, with each unit costing Rs 1000. The 64 beneficiaries selected included employees

and contract staff from VSSC and APEP, carefully categorized into groups, on the basis of the severity of damages suffered by each and also their financial background. The distribution function was solemnised by the Director, VSSC.

IV. SOFA (School-Opening Financial Aid) at RCC – June 2019

I-CARE proposed a scheme at the start of academic year 2019, with each SOFA unit costing Rs. 1000, to lend a helping hand to the less privileged children and their parents. Monetary support was given for buying the essential items (not school kits) to the school children, who lost their father/ or whose fathers are seriously sick, like children of Cancer patients belonging to financially weaker sections. Around 310 SOFA units were offered to the beneficiaries including TA charges for a few. Director, VSSC graced the



function at RCC, where lunch (Annam Amrithum) was also arranged for the outpatients and by-standers.

VI. Activities during July 2019 - Dec 2019

I-CARE received overwhelming response from ISRO community towards the treatment costs and monetary support for family of Mr. Chandran Nair, ex-VRC kiosk at VSSC. He had endeared himself to one and all before he met with a road accident and was under ventilator support for long. Funds were released to his family in multiple steps as the situation demanded.

Financial support was extended to the family of Mr. Shiju CK, an attender in contract for GSLV, VSSC, who passed away due to severe cardiac illness and associated kidney failure. Mr. Jeyarose, a gang labourer at LPSC, who suffered heart attack, was also offered assistance. Other beneficiaries included Mr. Sunil Kumar, ITI fitter, Valiyamala, who met with an accident affecting his vision and Mr. Sivakumar, contract staff at LPSC Canteen, who underwent two surgeries and developed inflection in blood post an accident. Mr. C.T. Jayan, Fireman, was offered financial assistance to get discharged from Cosmo Hospital, where he was admitted to ICU for a fortnight. Monetary aid was also given to Ms. Nivetha, a needy student who had lost her father.

I-CARE was registered as a charitable trust on 15/11/2019 after generating byelaws with official consent from VSSC. Thereafter, an executive committee was constituted for managing the functioning of the trust. The registration charges were drawn from the corpus fund of I-CARE.

VII. Activities during Jan 2020 - July 2020

The new year 2020 started off with “Annam Amritham” lunch programme at RCC. As part of reaching out to special kids in the new year, I-CARE team visited Sahajeevan Special School, Pallippuram. Director, VSSC was kind enough to interact with the students and present them gifts. All 87 students were given stationery gifts and buffet special lunch in addition to common items for school like Fly killer lamp, Traction bed (for Physiotherapy) and Re-chargeable emergency lights.

I-CARE extended its arms towards Mr. Padmanabhan, son of a 84-year old widower, who died after being bed-ridden subsequent to a fall at his work-site. The team used to visit his residence to offer solace to the patient who was suffering from severe bed sores and offered regular interim reliefs.

Emergency financial aid was offered to Ms. Ameya, a first standard student, diagnosed with Acute Myeloid Leukemia, who was undergoing treatment at CMC, Vellore. Ms. Gadha S Giri, a girl with cerebral palsy, undergoing treatment at Sri Chithra and Medical College, was given some money for her hip surgery.

Mr. Thomas Joseph, a casual labourer from Changanacherry, suffering from serious brain tumours, was offered an interim amount to meet the treatment expenses at Sri Chithra Medical Centre. Mr. Sudheer, employed at LPSC canteen, having a daughter and desperate after losing his wife with breast cancer, was also offered some aid, besides Mr. Biju, an RCC patient.

I-CARE initiated timely activities to help the most-affected by the COVID-19 pandemic when nation-wide lockdown was announced. ISRO employees sponsored COVID ASWAS units, each unit costing Rs. 1000. Professional bodies and welfare societies also contributed generously towards the noble cause. 712 beneficiaries of the initiative included Contract/Casual Labourers, Janitorial staff, Gardening staff, Kiosk staff and a few non-ISRO people.

A. Introduction

I-CARE is a trust registered under Indian Charitable Trust Act with Director, VSSC as its patron. Permanent employees of ISRO, including retired staff, are its members. Right from its inception, it has been involved in various charity initiatives, with the beneficiaries ranging from individuals to groups. This report consolidates the details of I-CARE initiatives for the period Aug – Nov, 2020.

B. Summary of I-CARE Activities

I-CARE had undertaken timely activities to help around 700+ people, most-affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, with the generous contributions of ISRO employees, Professional bodies and Welfare societies. Subsequently, the Executive Committee (EC) members discussed the need to generate revenue to meet the increasing number of requests for financial assistance. For creating a reserve fund to meet exigencies, especially in cases where the beneficiaries are from ISRO employees, voluntary contributions on a regular basis, were initiated from August 2020 onwards.

In the monthly EC meetings, the committee deliberated on the numerous requests for assisting severely ill patients under hospitalization. The genuineness of the individual cases was verified by the I-CARE team members and the amount sanctioned after assessing on a case-by-case basis. The list of beneficiaries for the last 4 months is attached in Annexure I.

C. Highlights

I. Goodwill Gesture Worth Emulating

I-CARE places on record the following contributions towards noble causes:

1. Sri. Sunil Kumar, HPDD, donated Rs 25,000 on his superannuation in Aug, 2020.



2. Sri. Anil Babu R, VSSC, set aside Rs 50,000 from his son's wedding expenses in Oct, 2020 to help the most- needy through I-CARE, for which 10 beneficiaries have been identified from RCC.
3. ISRO employees had contributed Rs 6,39,700 towards COVID-19 campaign.
4. Professional bodies/ Welfare Societies had donated Rs 3,50,000 for helping those affected by the pandemic.

With the overwhelming support of ISRO employees and professional bodies/societies, I-CARE could donate Rs 9,48,000 to 712 beneficiaries including Contract/Casual Labourers, Janitorial staff, Gardening staff, Kiosk staff and a few non-ISRO people.

5. Around 65 ISRO employees have been making regular voluntary contributions on a monthly basis from August 2020 onwards, in order to meet the exigencies and requests for financial aid from several quarters. The list is included in Annexure II.

II. Continuing Support Scheme

1. Aged father of late Sri. Padmanabhan (who died after being bed-ridden subsequent to a fall at his work-site), is being supported with a monthly payment of Rs 1000 for 6 months from Aug, 2020 onwards.
2. Sri. Narayanan, former contract employee at RPP, is being given a monthly instalment of Rs 2,500 for 6 months from Aug, 2020 onwards.
3. Smt. Sobha L, undergoing treatment at RCC, is being given an aid of Rs 2000 every month for a period of 1 year starting from Sept, 2020.



III. Obituary

I-CARE offers heartfelt condolences on the sad demise of :

1. Sri. Chandran Nair, ex-staff at VSSC Kiosk and an Ottamthullal artist, who was in Coma state for almost 1 year after he met with a scooter accident. I-CARE had contributed Rs 8.5 lakhs, with the whole-hearted support of ISRO employees, to the family of Sri. Chandran Nair.
2. Sri. Arun Kumar AG, who died while undergoing multi-organ dysfunction treatment. I-CARE had donated Rs 25, 000 for his treatment.
3. Sri.Surendran Nair KR, from Kottayam, who expired after battling Lung Cancer. I-CARE had donated Rs 10,000 for his treatment.

D. Conclusion

Detailed account statements were generated for all transactions, through online banking and in cash, audited by H Vinod & Associates Chartered Accountants and Audit Report is released.
